ENGAGING YOUTH PROGRAMS

WHO: Youth grades K-12

WHEN: Scheduled throughout the year

WHAT: Educational programs scheduled for onehalf to one hour or more on a variety of topics that correspond to the standards. We can come to your site.

COST: Listed by each program. In general, quoted rates are for 25 participants or less. Call if your class size is larger.

FOR MORE INFORMATION: Visit franklin.osu.edu. Look for the 4-H Tab and then scroll down to "school enrichment".

AVAILABLE PROGRAMS:

Seed planting: Youth plant a seed in a cup and learn about the plant life cycle and/or other related topics.(Grades K-5 suggested); fifty cents per child.

Rockets Away! Participants will make and launch a two-liter bottle rocket (Grades 3-8 suggested; younger with help). \$1.00 per child.

Honey Bee Challenge. Participants learn about Honey Bee pollination as they build a working robot out of a toothbrush. (Grades 4-8; younger with help). \$5.50 per child (cost can be reduced through group sharing).

Test Tube Lava Lamp. Youth create a "lava lamp" and learn about carbon dioxide. (Grades K-5+) \$1.00 per child.

Chickquest. An incubation program with an incubator you can borrow with a check deposit. Download the guidelines from our website. (Curriculum designed for grades 3-4, but available to all grades).

Real Money, Real World. A hands-on approach to financial literacy that features four lessons and concludes with a simulation. Free for 35+ children. (Grades 8-12). Contact: lobb.3@osu.edu.
