FOUNDERS' SCHOLARSHIP

APPLICATION DUE: JANUARY 31

The Founders' Scholarship will be awarded to a select number of 2020 CCS seniors who meet a set of specific criteria, including a 3.0+ GPA. The Founders' Scholarship is worth up to \$10,000 per year.

DREAM BIG SCHOLARSHIP

APPLICATION DUE: FEBRUARY 28

The Dream Big Scholarship is worth \$3,500 per year and will be awarded to a select number of 2020 CCS seniors who meet a set of specific criteria, including a 2.75+ GPA.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is an application created and collected by the U.S. Department of Education. The application collects financial information from students and their parents and is later used to determine eligibility for college financial aid.

Documents Needed to File a FAFSA

DON'T FORGET: Register for your FSA ID before your workshop. The student and one parent must register for an FSA ID. Visit www.fsaaid.ed.gov and be sure to bring your FSA log-in to the workshop!

To efficiently and successfully submit a FAFSA, students and their parents need the following documents:

NOTE: You may be able to have your tax information imported automatically from the IRS into your FAFSA, which can make the process faster and easier. When you are filling out the FAFSA, you can log in to the IRS website (irs.gov) by providing your name and other required information to find out if you are eligible.
